(Product must say “Kosher for Passover” to be used.)

This list is subject to change without notice.

Many Israeli products are certified kosher by two, three, or even four kashrus agencies. Seeing the wording “Kosher for Passover” (either in English or in Hebrew) alone on a product is insufficient to accept it. Often, the recommended kashrus agency does not accept a product as Passover friendly, while a not-recommended agency does. The mashgiach must be able to determine which kashrus agency has affixed the KFP determination on the product. If it is unclear, contact the ORB rabbis for clarification.
